

**150 ARTISTS - OUTDOORS - CANYON ROAD - SATURDAY*****Historic Canyon Road Paint and Sculpt Out*****October 20 & 21, 2017**


150 artists will convene en masse in the venerable Canyon Road art district for the Historic Paint and Sculpt Out. The day will be filled with opportunities to meet and interact with artists, to learn their processes, to discover their passions, and to share their secrets.

Friday, October 20th will mark the beginning of Paint and Sculpt Out festivities at many galleries. Galleries, restaurants, and shops will be open all day and many have special events that will carry into the evening. Gallery openings, artist demonstrations, exhibitions, music, and opportunities to sample culinary delights are abundant at the Friday Art Walk from 5-7.


The Paint and Sculpt Out offers the rare opportunity to engage with top-tier artists creating new works of art - in real time. Close to one hundred painters and more than a dozen sculptors are expected. Other artists will demonstrate how they use precious metals, clay, beads, fossils, wood, glass, stone, textiles, gold, and silver to create their art.

There will be something for everyone to enjoy at this family friendly event. Art lovers will witness the creation of new works in virtually every media. Emerging artists can interact with and learn from established artists. Collectors will discover opportunities to meet the artists, request private commissions, and acquire original works. Whether your preference is contemporary, abstract, modern, expressionistic, figurative, photorealistic, traditional, western or Native American, it's all here.



During the Paint and Sculpt Out, artist demonstrations will take place from Paseo de Peralta to East Palace Avenue along Canyon Road and on side streets. Many artists set up in front of individual galleries. Others can be found in sculpture gardens and inside the historic adobes that line the road. It will be impossible to find all of the artists, but definitely worth the effort. 27 Galleries will be hosting artists and dozens of independent artists will just set up at the middle and top of the road.

**More**


Plan to spend at least a full day on Canyon Road. Visitors and artists are always welcome. Friday – Galleries and shops open at 10 all weekend. Many artists in town for the Paint Out will be spending time in galleries and specialty shops. Friday Art Walk begins at 5. Daytime temperatures will rise to the mid-sixties and there is very little chance of precipitation Friday, Saturday or Sunday.




The road is always a magical place for a good walk, but it is particularly exquisite in the fall. On Saturday, some artists will be arriving early to capture the morning light. Cafes are open at both ends of the road and restaurants are open late on Friday and Saturday.




Wear comfortable shoes; bring a jacket, hat and camera. The lower end of the art district begins at the intersection of Canyon Road and Paseo de Peralta and goes uphill to the intersection with East Palace Avenue. Some of the walkways are uneven and the road is narrow as it rises toward the Sangre de Cristo Mountains. Consider starting at the top of the road near East Palace Avenue and walking down.




There are two parking lots that serve the art district - one at the top of the road near East Palace Avenue and one a block south of the bottom of the road where it intersects with Paseo de Peralta.



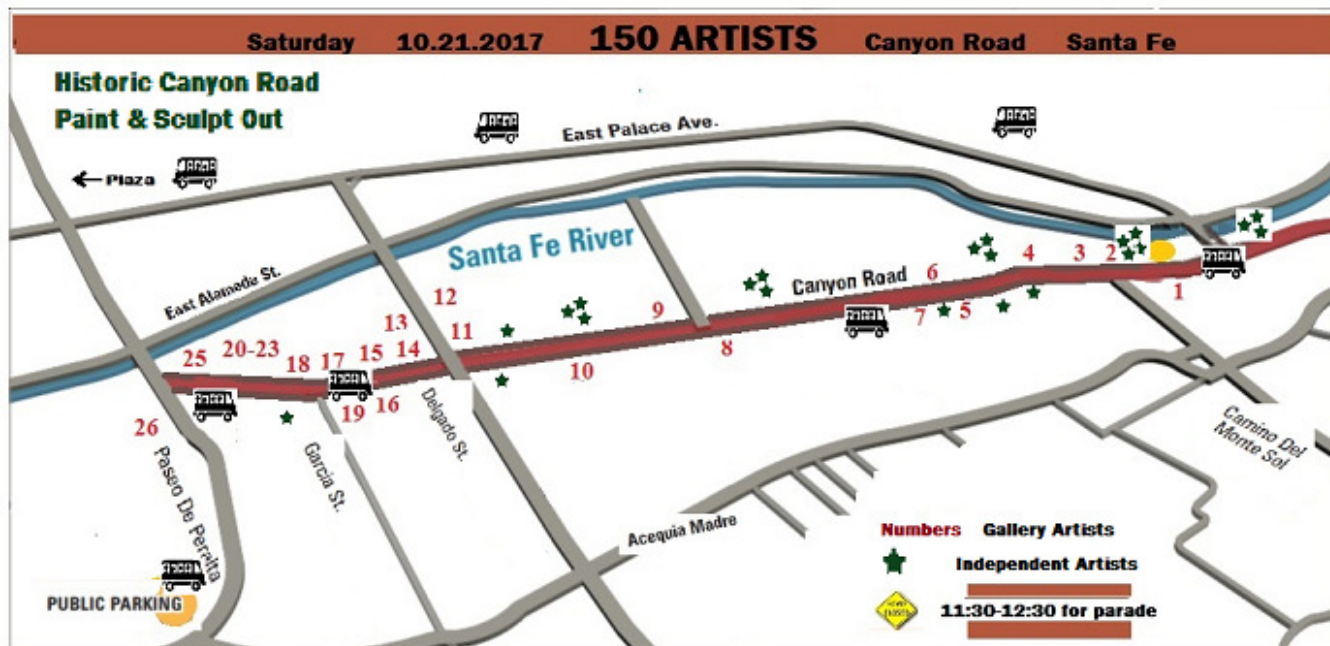
Both are served by the Santa Fe Pick-up, a free shuttle that runs every 20-30 minutes until 5:30p.m. It has four stops on Canyon Road – the final one at East Palace Avenue. The shuttle can be picked up at many locations downtown, and in the historic, railyard, and museum districts.



Canyon Road will be closed to vehicular traffic from 11:30 to 12:30 on Saturday for the noon parade. Traffic back-ups on neighboring streets are expected during this time.



This is the 8th year SFPS Music Education programs have partnered with Canyon Road to bring student musicians to this historical event. Hundreds of students will turn out on Saturday to perform in the only All-SFPS MUSIC PARADE will march up the road from 12-12:30. Bands, choirs, elementary music troupes, pianists, and string orchestras will perform at individual galleries. Performance details are on VisitCanyonRoad.com.
